Section 1. Definitions and Interpretation.

(a) The term "at large," as used in this ordinance,¹ shall mean "off the property on which an animal or fowl shall normally be kept."

(b) The word "livestock," as used in this ordinance, shall mean and include animals such as pigs, goats, sheep, horses and cattle, but shall not include domestic animals normally kept as pets, such as dogs and cats.

(c) The word "person," as used in this ordinance, shall mean and include any natural person, partnership, association, firm or corporation.

(d) In this ordinance, the singular shall include the plural, the plural shall include the singular, and the masculine shall include the feminine and the neuter.²

Section 2. Unlawful to Permit Livestock and Fowl to Run at Large. It shall be unlawful for any person to permit any livestock owned by him, or under his care and control, to run at large anywhere within the limits of the Borough. (Ordinance 60, October 2, 1972, Section 2)

Section 3. Restrictions on Keeping Hogs and Horses. It shall be unlawful for any person to keep any hog or horse anywhere in the Borough within one thousand (1,000) feet of any dwelling not occupied or owned by the owner of the hog or horse. (Ordinance 60, October 2, 1972, Section 3)

Section 4. Restrictions on Keeping Cattle. It shall be unlawful for any person to keep and permit any cattle to come together and congregate in numbers on any vacant land within the Borough within one thousand (1,000) feet of any dwelling or public building not owned or occupied by the owner of such cattle. (Ordinance 60, October 2, 1972, Section 4)

Section 5. Penalty for Violation. Any person who shall violate any provision of this ordinance shall, for each and every such violation, upon conviction thereof, be sentenced to pay a fine of not more than fifty dollars (\$50.00) and costs of prosecution, and, in default of payment of such fine and costs, to imprisonment for not more than ten (10) days. Provided: each day's continuance of any such violation, following conviction thereof, shall constitute a separate violation. (Ordinance 60, October 2, 1972, Section 5)
