Part 1
Elected and Appointed Officers

Section 1. Mayor's Salary Fixed. The salary of the Mayor of Harrisville is hereby fixed at one hundred twenty dollars (\$120.00) per annum, payable in monthly installments. (Ordinance 56, October 2, 1972)

Section 2. Compensation of Councilmen Fixed. The compensation of each member of the Council of the Borough of Harrisville is hereby fixed at ten dollars (\$10.00) for each regular monthly meeting of the Council which he shall attend. (Ordinance 57, October 2, 1972)

Section 3. Tax Collector's Commission Fixed. The commission of the Tax Collector of the Borough of Harrisville for the collection of Borough taxes is hereby fixed at the rate of five per centum (5%) of all Borough taxes collected by him. (Ordinance 58, October 2, 1972)

Part 2
Boards and Commissions

Section 31. Borough Planning Commission Created. A Borough Planning Commission, composed of five (5) members, appointed in the manner provided by law, is hereby created and established in and for the Borough of Harrisville. The said Borough Planning Commission may exercise all the powers and shall perform all the duties vested by law in planning agencies for boroughs. (Ordinance 59, October 2, 1972)

Part 3
Firemen's Relief

Section 51. Harrisville Volunteer Fire Company and Relief Association of Harrisville, Pennsylvania, Recognized. The Harrisville Volunteer Fire Company and Relief Association of Harrisville, Pennsylvania, be and it is hereby officially recognized by the Borough Council of the Borough of Harrisville as an organization formed for the purpose of maintaining an association for beneficial and protective purposes, to its members and their families in case of death, sickness, temporary or permanent disability or accident, from the funds collected therein. ¹ (October 22, 1938, Section 1)

Section 52. Relief Association Designated to Receive Moneys from Foreign Fire Insurance Tax. The aforesaid Harrisville Volunteer Fire Company and Relief Association be and it is hereby designated by the Borough Council of the Borough of Harrisville, Pennsylvania, as the proper association to receive such funds as are due and payable to the Borough treasury by the Treasurer of the State of Pennsylvania from the two per centum tax on premiums from foreign fire insurance companies. (October 22, 1938, Section 2)

Section 53. Annual Appropriations to Relief Association. There is hereby annually appropriated from the Borough treasury all such sum or sums of money that may hereafter be paid into the aforementioned Borough treasury by the Treasurer of the State of Pennsylvania, on account of taxes paid on premiums by foreign fire insurance in pursuance to an Act of Assembly in such cases made and provided. (October 22, 1938, Section 3)
